### 2009 Annual Report The McConnell Foundation

In 2009, the Foundation continued its commitment to long-term and ongoing projects such as Turtle Bay Exploration Park; Children, Youth & Education; The McConnell Fund at the Shasta Regional Community Foundation; the annual Yosemite National Park high-school trip; the annual City of Redding fireworks show; giving in the countries of Nepal and Laos; and sharing the space at Lema Ranch.

The Foundation Board committed in 2008 to build a Platinum LEED-certified K-8 public charter school for Redding School of the Arts (RSA) as a Program Related Investment (PRI). The construction is well underway, and the Foundation and all partners are working together diligently to complete the school by Spring 2011. The Foundation's hope is that the school will be a learning laboratory to exhibit sustainability. The curriculum will have sustainable practices woven throughout. The school will be a model for those hoping to embark on their own green building projects.

The Foundation has also stepped up its commitment to greening its buildings and the organization. A sustainability committee has been formed, with representatives from each area of the organization. The committee meets regularly to scrutinize such purchasing decisions as cleaning products, chemical fertilizers, and even technology-related purchases. Significant energy-reducing measures have been put in place, most cleaning chemicals have been changed to less-toxic solutions, and organic fertilizers are now used instead of most chemicals. All employee travel is now tracked and, last year, for the first time, carbon offsets were purchased for travel.
